



THE BYZANTINE TEXT OF THE GREEK GOSPELS

LECTURE BY GEORGI PARPULOV

This lecture will survey the medieval history of the continuous (as opposed to lectionary) text of the Greek Gospels. It will focus more closely on a homogeneous and large group of manuscripts called “Revised Koine,” “Kr,” or “Family 35,” examining the historical circumstances under which it was produced and disseminated during the fourteenth century.
